to discriminate against you in:

- Reprisal

Under the *Minnesota Human Rights Act #363*, it's illegal to discriminate against you because of:

- Age
- Creed
- Color
- Dependence on public assistance
- Disability
- Familial status
- Local commission status
- Marital status
- National origin
- Race
- Religion
- Sex
- Sexual preference
