



GIVE YOUR LITTLE ONE A BOOST — IT'S THE LAW!

In Minnesota, children cannot ride in just a seat belt until they are 8 years old or 4 feet 9 inches tall, whichever comes first. It is recommended to keep a child in a booster based on their size rather than age.

Boosters are seat lifts that allow belts to fit safely and properly. Boosters are for children starting around age 4 after they outgrow a forward-facing safety seat.

A child is ready for a seat belt only if they can sit with their back against the vehicle seat with their knees bent comfortably and completely over the seat's edge.
